# Letter from The Chair

Dear all,

Well spring has finally arrived, the snowdrops and daffodils are out and all we need now is some Spring like weather to go with them.

By now I would hope you have all heard about the proposed Pylons that would go through our village. At our Parish Council meeting we voted unanimously that we were totally opposed to this method being used for the grid upgrade. Not only would it spoil our views up to the Wolds, but it would take up too much of our much needed farmland, upset our wildlife and devalue a lot of the properties in the village. That is without the upset caused both mentally and physically while the Pylons were being put into place.

I have on behalf of the council and our villages sent a letter to National Grid and various other people detailing that we are opposed to the Pylons and urging them to look into the other options available and not to just think about the cash but to understand the upset it would cause to so many lives.

I hope you have all had your say either online or by sending in the objection slips. However, we must not put this to the back of our minds as the fight has only just started and there will be much more to come.

The exceptional rain we have had lately has caused flooding in some areas of the villages. As a council we continue to take these and other issues seriously and are constantly reporting them and trying to get action taken to improve our area.

If there is a specific problem you feel we may not know about please do contact one of the councillors or myself, we are here to put your case forward. There are always councillors at the weekly Cafe in the Parish Rooms and at the Monthly Lunch held in St Mary's Church so please feel free to approach us. Alternatively, you can get in touch by email or phone.

There are lots of events planned to take place during this year some at the Parish Rooms, some at St Mary's Church and also at St Bart's. These are all run by volunteers who just want to make our villages a nicer, more friendly place. So whenever you can please come along and enjoy these functions and support those who work so hard to arrange them. You will all be very welcome to any event.

All that remains for me to do is wish you all well and don't forget we are here if you need us.

# Parish Council News

- Restrictive Covenant removed. The Methodist Church Trustees have agreed to remove the restriction on the supply and sale of alcohol and that the value of the consideration removing the restriction does not need to be paid unless and until the Parish Rooms is sold. The value of the consideration has been put at £5,000. The Parish Council is grateful to Covenham Village Volunteers especially to the Chairman, Nicky Gulley Brown who liaised with the Methodist Church Trustees and settled this issue. The support of Cllr Edward Mossop, the ELDC Ward Member, is also acknowledged.
- *Parish Rooms.* The Parish Council has agreed in principle to lease the Parish Rooms to Covenham Village Volunteers. The lease agreement is now being reviewed by a solicitors' firm and it is hoped that the agreement will be signed soonest.
- Bank account Mandate issues. Barclays Bank has upheld the Parish Council's complaint on how they dealt with changes to the bank mandate signatories. The Bank credited the Parish Council with £200 and delivered a hamper to the Chair as a goodwill gesture. The Parish Council agreed to donate the hamper to St Barnabas Hospice for their fund raising event. A raffle to win the hamper at their Christmas Carols event in Lincoln generated £200.  National Grid Grimsby to Walpole Proposal. Covenham Parish Council as a statutory authority has sent its strong objection to the

proposal to build pylons in the parish. Meetings have been held in the Parish Rooms and residents attended the consultation events. The Parish Council has joined other parish councils in the county as well as Lincolnshire County Council in strongly objecting to the proposal. The two Members of Parliament for Lincolnshire have also voiced their objections.

The Great Grid Upgrade is coming to your door.

The National Grid is proposing to bring 87miles of cables through our area strung from Pylons measuring 164ft (50m) and carrying a whopping 400KV right over our heads. This is electricity generated out at sea from wind turbines that will be used in and around London.

The Grimsby to Walpole stage is just one of 11 planned phases across the country in a bid meet Net Zero targets by 2050. And whilst we can all agree on the benefits of Green Energy and improving our aging Electricity infrastructure National Grid appear to be favouring the cheapest and quickest way and not the solution that offers the best results for the long term.

## PYLONS ARE NOT PROGRESS

The recent underground Viking Link development has led the way in what is possible in this area and set the standard for all future projects so why have the National Grid taken a Step backward in the Grimsby to Walpole proposal.


# Eleemosynary Charity
