Letter from The Chair

Dear All.

Hello to everyone both long time dwellers in the villages and a special welcome to any new comers.

Well here we are three quarters of our way through 2023 already and for the most part it has been a good year with various events taking place in the village and may I say thank you and well done to all the people that give up their time to organise and run these things whether it is at the Parish Rooms, St Mary's Church or at St. Bart's. I look forward to many more to come and also hope to meet and get to know many more people from the villages. So please do look out for these events and come along and join in.

I do have one thing to report that I am not happy about however. Graffiti that has taken place on the North Wall of St Bart's church. This is going to be very expensive and time consuming to remove due to the type of brick it is on. It has been done in red spray paint, various words and some crosses and in particular one that appears to relate to 'SLIPKNOT' which I am told is a heavy metal band. A spray can that was found in the water near the bridge on the footpath through St Mary's and a splash of paint on the bridge and on a tree in that area which has all been reported to the police. This does not appear to have been done by small children because of the height of the graffiti etc. So I am appealing to you all to please be aware of this and make it known that this is not something we want to happen again and that we would not hesitate to report it if any person was found doing this in future. Please be proud of your village and help us all look after it.

Once again we have had some high winds and it has been brought to my attention that quite a lot of quite thick branches have come down on the footpaths, road, etc. through the village and there is some concern that at some point this could cause harm. I would be very grateful if we could all keep an eye on trees on our property that may impact on the footpaths and road as we go into the winter months and look out for anything that may be a hazard.

If anyone from the villages needs to get in touch with one of our Parish Councillors our names and contact details are not only in this newsletter but also on our website. If you would like to meet us in person there are always several councillors at the Friday Cafe in the Parish rooms so please pop in and ask for a chat; also at the monthly Lunch held at St Mary's, myself and councillor Anne McCready are always there and you are welcome to just call in and ask to speak to us. We are all here to help if we can.

Finally, on November 12th we will once again be holding a short Remembrance Service around the memorial at St Bart's. We will start to gather at 10.45am to enable us to hold the two minutes' silence at 11am and finish by 11.15am after which everyone is welcome to come to the Parish Rooms for a hot drink. Please do come along and join us in paying our respect.

Thank you for taking the time to read this and please if you have anything that you think good to put in any future newsletters let me know. Little anecdotes or stories about the village from the past, poems or photos it would be good to have some input from you the Villagers of Covenham.

Parish Council News

- Welcome. Lesley Jackson and Anna Smith were both unanimously voted in as newly co-opted parish councillors at the meeting held last in July. They have moved back from Fulstow and live at Grange Lane.
- *Farewell*. The Parish Council gave their thanks to Angela Aylett who resigned from the Parish Council in August due to work loads.
- Restrictive Covenant: The Parish Council applied to the Methodist Church Trustees to lift the restriction on consumption/sale of alcohol at the Parish Rooms which were conveyed from the Methodist Church back in the 1980's. The local Methodist Group has agreed in principle but the legal overseers, The Trustees for Methodist Church Purposes based in Manchester required further legal opinion in order to fulfil Charity Law. The cost of legal opinion will be at Parish Council expense. The implications are yet unknown and the decision from Manchester is still being awaited. The Parish Council is grateful to Cllr Edward Mossop, the ELDC Ward Member, for his support liaising with the Methodist Trustees.

If you would like to come along and have a pleasant chat over a nice lunch then we would be pleased to see you.


We just ask that you let us know you are coming by the Sunday before for catering purposes which will be 29th October.

The Poors Allotment Fund

The Poors Allotment is split into an Ecclesiastical Charity and the Eleemosynary. The trustees of the Ecclesiastical Charity are the current churchwardens of St. Mary's and the Eleemosynary has up to two trustees appointed by the Parish Council.

The income of the Poors fund is from land owned by the trust which is currently leased out for farming and also from an investment made when the old Blacksmith's shop was sold. Each charity receives half of the income twice a year. The Trustees also meet twice a year to discuss any issues.

The Ecclesiastical part of the money goes to St. Mary's church. The money received by the Eleemosynary is for use in the village. Over the years changes have been made as to how this money can be used and currently it is for anyone of any age group who needs genuine financial assistance.

Changes as to how the charity uses the money have to be agreed with the Charity Commission and recently we have included rural isolation which was why we were able to provide a free meal for the Platinum Jubilee celebrations in 2022.

Any resident in the villages of Covenham St. Mary and Covenham St. Bartholomew is entitled to apply to the charity for help, but there has to be full financial disclosure to the Trustees with regard to income and expenditure. Any approach and subsequent meetings are held in the strictest confidence.

We have not received any claims for some time despite advertising in the Village Newsletter and on the noticeboards. To give you an idea of assistance that we have given in the past, we have helped fund a stair lift, buy a new fridge/freezer, given out food vouchers and helped with a car repair.

The Donald Witney Memorial Fund

Grants available to young people

This charitable fund was set up in the memory of Donald Witney, an eminent Louth citizen, one-time Headmaster of King Edward VI School.

The Louthesk Deanery Synod who are the trustees of the fund are able to consider applications for funding from those of school age and up to 25 years, who reside within the Louthesk Deanery, **this includes**Covenham. Grants can be given to assist them in the costs of such activities as attending Christian conferences or courses, carrying out expeditions to under-privileged parts of the world, or advancing their studies or skills e.g. undergoing an organ scholarship.

Graffiti in the Village

Recently we were very disappointed to find red graffiti on the north side of St Barts Church. This is a Grade II* listed building so it will need specialist and undoubtedly expensive removal.

Judging by the height of the graffiti it was someone of around 6 foot tall – The words 'Jesus Lives' were written alongside a floriated cross and a pentagram.

Our graffiti artist is obviously a 'Slipknot' fan (yes, we had to look it up, they are an American Heavy Metal Rock Band who refer to their fans as Maggots).

Another red mark was found on both bridges and the word Slipknot was found on a tree in St Mary's churchyard.

An empty can of red paint was discovered in the stream on the footpath which runs behind St Mary's Church.

Furthermore, a tall young man (late teens, early twenties) was seen acting oddly in this area shortly before the graffiti was found, he was trying hard not to be seen, he hung around for a while and when he saw he was being watched, walked off towards the churchyard gate leading onto Cold Harbour Lane. No bicycle was seen so it is assumed this young man is local to the village and he would be recognised if seen again.

This incident has been reported to Lincolnshire Police as a Heritage Crime (which carries heavier penalties). The empty can, a description of the young man and his musical preferences have also been forwarded. Should you have any information which could be useful please contact Louth Police quoting Crime Number 306/19/08/2023.

While a hard-working group of volunteers are trying to raise funding to restore the church it is hard to fathom the mind of someone who could do this mindless vandalism.
