# Letter from The Chair

Dear residents of Covenham,

This past year the council has worked hard to make it possible for the CVV to take over the lease of the Parish Rooms, to enable them to, through grants, be able to improve the facilities and make the rooms more useable and welcoming for all of our residents. They have done a great job so far and I look forward to seeing what can be done to improve the building even more in the future. The events are open to all, and I hope that as many of you as possible go along and support them.

On Remembrance Sunday a short commemoration took place at the memorial at St Bart's and was well attended, it was lovely to see people there once again. The council laid their usual wreath and this year we had a second laid by CVV as well as two crosses placed at the memorial by local residents. Afterwards refreshments were supplied in the Parish Rooms by the CVV and I would like to thank them for doing this once again. Also thanks for the work done around the memorial and the lovely flowers planted.

As a council if we see or get reported to us things that need doing in Covenham we do our best to get things put right. It sometimes takes us a long time to do this by keep on reporting to the district council and also getting our local district and county councillors to push items forward, but we do not let things drop. So please if there is something you think needs attention do not hesitate to report this to any one of our Parish Councillors who will be only too glad to hear from you.

There are always councillors at the weekly coffee event run by CVV and also at the Monthly Lunch held in St Mary's Church so feel free to pop in and see them. We can also be reached by phone or email.

It is great to see that at last Cold Harbour Lane is going to get the resurface it so desperately has needed for a long time; this is just one example of council and parishioners working together and keep on plugging away. Do get in touch if we can help in any way.

Now I am going to ask for your help, we are trying to get the steps and footpath reinstated from Grange Lane up to the reservoir. To do this we need a lot of evidence for how long these steps have been open to the public. So, if you have any photos taken in the past of walks up to the reservoir we would like a copy to submit as evidence, or if you can remember using this access in years gone by please write a note for us again to use as proof, detailing when it was etc. Every little bit helps. You can leave anything you can and let us have in the Council Post Box at the Parish rooms or if you want a copy of a photo made, please let me know.

We are still very much against the use of Pylons through our village and will keep monitoring the situation. Earlier this year I had to do a scoping letter and send it to the relevant department in Parliament, I had a lot of help from other residents to make sure I presented all the facts, so I thank them for their help. Now we can only wait to see what else we can do in the future.

Finally as we come to that time of year again I would like on behalf of myself and the rest of the Parish Councillors to wish you all a VERY HAPPY and PEACEFUL CHRISTMAS and hope the NEW YEAR brings much good health and happiness to you all.

# Parish Council News

- New Parish Councillor. Mark Waller from Covenham St Mary was unanimously voted in as a co-opted Councillor in the meeting held 1<sup>st</sup> August 2024. Mark is a Configuration and Asset Analyst for KCom.
  - There are still three available seats in the Parish Council. If you are interested in community affairs and have time to attend meetings on a bi-monthly basis, please get in touch with any of the councillors or contact the Parish Clerk on <a href="mailto:parishclerkcpc@gmail.com">parishclerkcpc@gmail.com</a>
- Restrictive Covenant: The Council is still waiting for the deed of release from the solicitors representing the Methodist Trustees. This is the final step in removing the restriction on the supply and sale of alcohol in the Parish Rooms. The release settles the agreement between The Parish Council and the Methodist Trustees on a £5,000 consideration if and when the Parish Rooms is sold.
- *Parish Rooms.* The lease agreement between the Parish Council and Covenham Village Volunteers (CVV)was signed and took effect August 2024. CVV has been very busy since, with all the refurbishments. New tables and chairs have been purchased. The blue chairs given by East Lindsey District Council have been given away. There is now central heating, running hot water and Wi-Fi.
  - The Parish Council has agreed to purchase the outbuilding behind the Parish Rooms from the property owner. It is hoped to be transformed into a Changing Places toilet by CVV.
- Covenham Reservoir Steps. The Parish Council will apply to Lincolnshire County Council (LCC) for a Definitive Map Modification Order to make the steps a public right of way (PROW). The application requires a lot of evidence to be submitted to prove that the steps from Grange Lane was used for at least 20 years. Any photos of residents/visitors on this route will help. This is in response to Anglian Water stating they are not legally required to reinstate the south bank reservoir steps for public use and, unfortunately, have no future plans to do so due to the significant investment required for the reinstatement of the steps and future associated maintenance costs.



# Covenham Village Volunteers

Covenham Village Volunteers have expanded this year - in both numbers of volunteers and variety of events we have held.

In August we took a 5-year lease on the Parish Rooms at the same time we received a grant from Grass Roots SPFUK which enabled us

to start on the renovations and install central heating, redecorate throughout and have running hot water. We have now received a second grant, this will allow new accessible doors and ramps as well as a kitchen upgrade, we are aware there are a few of you in Covenham who currently may struggle to access our newly decorated and now very warm rooms. You won't have long to wait as this work is scheduled for February 2025 all things being equal.

We are on the lookout for local/Covenham Photos please - to borrow, have or copy as we would like to apply for funding for new disabled and family friendly facilities. We would like to make a photographic display of Covenham through the ages. Please get in touch if you have some we can use or borrow.

We have a wreath making workshop  $30^{\text{th}}$  November, Craft and Cafe will continue on Thursdays till  $12^{\text{th}}$  December.



# The Covenham St Bartholomew Heritage Trust

I am pleased to say that St. Bartholomew's is once again open to the public as the two roof repairs have been completed. The next step is to look at roof replacement and we will keep you updated on progress.

Christmas is an odd time of year for me as I think about it from a historical point of view. It was a pagan ceremony "hijacked" by Christianity as Christ's birthday. The Romans did a similar thing when they rocked up in a new country, they would introduce their gods into the local religions rather than just throw the old gods out, it made the locals more compliant.

I am thinking about this right now as I am in Orkney visiting the Ness of Brodgar as well as other sites. The site is 5000 years old, it covers a huge area and it's full of archaeology. It is a ceremonial site or religious if you prefer and people that built all of this, abandoned it all and moved to Stonehenge. Probably a little more complicated than that but you get the gist.

Yesterday I was privileged to be in Maeshowe (chambered tomb) for a couple of hours with a professional archaeologist and the stunning skills shown in a building still standing after 5000 years (please take note Barrett Homes) without a drop of mortar in sight is to be marvelled at. The thing that really got me to thinking was the Viking graffiti. Vikings (and later the Normans) were also drawn to this site and left their mark in runes. The archaeologists have learnt so much from this vandalism from over a thousand years ago and yet there are signs at every site stating that graffiti is a crime. I was incensed when paint was sprayed over St. Bartholomew's and money was spent removing it and whilst a spray can of red paint will not last the test of time, at what age does graffiti become acceptable?
